We are looking forward to continued excellent relations to all our friends and partners and are excited about the things that are to come.

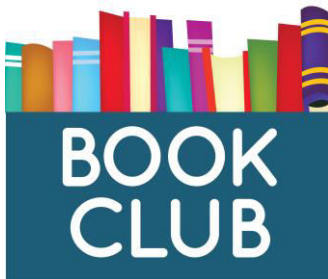

On the 8th March the Mayor of Bath, Cllr Dine Romero, hosted a reception for thirteen pupils of the Ricarda Huch Schule and two of their teachers. This is the first cohort of pupils to visit their exchange partners at King Edward's School since 2019, reviving a tradition that goes back over thirty years.

In April we were delighted to welcome the Lord Mayor of Brunswick to the first civic visit in over ten years. Dr Kornblum was accompanied by three Brunswick town councillors, the President of the Technische Universität, and three representatives of the Chambers of Crafts, Commerce and Industry as well as staff from the International office. The Mayor's staff in the Guildhall were able to arrange a full and comprehensive programme for their visit, with the aim of strengthening the ties between our two cities, and forging new links with Bath's Universities and members of Bath's business community.

They also had the opportunity to meet members of the public at a civic reception in the Guildhall, and at a talk given at BRLSI by Professor Ittel on internationalisation in the university context.
