#### 5<sup>th</sup> May: 24<sup>th</sup> Highland Gathering in Peine

Once a year, the Highland Gathering takes place in Peine. This year it was held in the Stadtpark on 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> May. A DEG group went there to find bagpipers and drummers as well as stalls offering all kinds of Scottish items such as jewellery, handicrafts and traditional goods. There was live music at the large open-air concert stage along with singing and Scottish-Irish dancing at a smaller stage.

The Peine Highland Gathering is the largest of its kind in mainland Europe. It was a lovely day and a great occasion to find out more about Scottish traditions.




